Dear Tom

We refer to the Minjerribah Rehabilitation and Surrender Plan and the obligation for QYAC to formally notify Sibelco of the infrastructure on the leases that are yet to be relinquished. QYAC provided this feedback informally at a meeting on 22 October 2019.

QYAC has inspected the infrastructure and provides the following list of building infrastructure that they would be prepared to accept if left on the lease area:

1. Kounpee;
 - A. No 49, new laboratory Bondor sandwich panel shed walls and roof, built 1990 with SS benches. Future use office space for nursery
 - B. No 57/58/70, Nursery area. Future use nursery
 - C. No 60, Shed, Future use storage for plant and equipment
 - D. No 63, Fuel storage area, future use fuel storage.
 - E. No 64, mechanical workshop, future use mechanical workshop
 - F. No 68, shed future use storage for plant and equipment
 - G. The Gate at the access to Kounpee
2. Glass;
 - A. No 30/31, mechanical workshop, future use Mechanical workshop until Kounpee become available.
3. Dunwich;
 - A. No 10, stores.
 - B. No 4, Training Centre

QYAC would be prepared to accept the two bores at the Glass leas, but apart from that requests that all bores are capped. The pump sets and associated pipe work at 18 Mile swamp and Blakesley would also be accepted by QYAC as incoming landowner.

QYAC would accept the roads, both sealed and unsealed. QYAC would also accept all power and associated electrical infrastructure. QYAC does not want to accept the communications infrastructure.
