Please find below and attached details of firetrail and APZ maintenance and construction commencing in the all 3 townships area over the next 2 months.

FIRETRAILS- Dunwich & Amity

Works to construct, maintain and upgrade the firetrails in Amity and Dunwich, Minjerribah
Approximate planned period of works between 22nd of July 2022 to 22nd August 2022

Firetrails will be constructed or upgraded to through mulching of understorey and regrowth vegetation. Mulch will be returned to the verges of the firelines. Large trees will be retained. Please be aware of machinery in active work areas and observe all safety messaging. QYAC thank you for your cooperation and patience.

ASSET PROTECTION ZONES – Point Lookout

The creation of remaining Asset protection zones at Point Lookout involves removing long grass, volatile shrubs and retaining large trees that surround housing and infrastructure, thereby creating defensible zones during wildfires.

Approximate start date of works 11th August 2022.

The Minjerribah Township Fire Management Strategy is a collaborative project led by QYAC with assistance from the Queensland Reconstruction Authority and is funded by the Queensland Department of Environment and Science, providing significant employment opportunities for Quandamooka People delivering land management outcomes on Quandamooka Country .
