



Environmental Authority (Approval) No. 150 306

Section 96 Environmental Protection Act 1994

This environmental authority is granted under the Environmental Protection Act 1994 and includes conditions to minimise environmental harm caused, or likely to be caused, by the authorised petroleum activities. An environmental authority (petroleum activities) may be for petroleum activities authorised (under the Petroleum and Gas (Production and Safety) Act 2004, Petroleum Act 1923 or Petroleum (Submerged Lands) Act 1982) to occur under one of the following petroleum authorities: authority to prospect; petroleum lease, data acquisition authority, water monitoring authority, petroleum facility licence, survey licence or pipeline licence. In general, a petroleum activity means an activity that, under the relevant petroleum legislation, is an authorised activity, rehabilitation, remediation, and includes facilitation and supporting activities and any action taken to prevent environmental harm.

Under the provisions of the *Environmental Protection Act 1994*, this environmental authority (approval) is issued to:

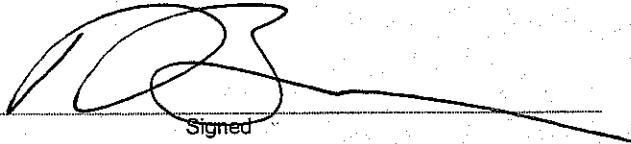

This environmental authority (approval) is subject to the condition that the holder carry out the above environmentally relevant activities in accordance with the conditions of the relevant pipeline licence(s) and in compliance with the Environmental Management Plan (submitted to the administering authority and any revisions to this Plan), 1998 APIA Code of Environmental Practice and the Departmental interim policy - *Environmental Management for Activities under Petroleum Tenures* (dated 4 September 1995). It is also issued on the condition that prior to construction the holder consult with the Department of Natural Resources and Mines, when a more detailed mapping scale of the pipeline route has been developed, to discuss natural resource management issues.



This environmental authority takes effect on **21 September 2005** and remains in force until a relevant pipeline licence is either transferred, surrendered or cancelled or until the environmental authority is transferred, surrendered, cancelled or suspended.
