



Environmental Authority No. M3952 **(mining activities)**

Section 244 Environmental Protection Act 1994.

This environmental authority is granted under the Environmental Protection Act 1994 and includes conditions to minimise environmental harm caused, or likely to be caused, by the authorised mining activities. An environmental authority (mining activities) may be for mining activities authorised (under the Mineral Resources Act 1989) to occur under one of the following mining tenements: a prospecting permit; mining claim; exploration permit; mineral development licence; or mining lease. In general, a mining activity means: prospecting, exploring, mining; or processing minerals; remediation; rehabilitation; and includes facilitation and supporting activities and any action taken to prevent environmental harm.

Schedule of conditions

- (1) The conditions of this environmental authority are in force until a surrender of the authority is accepted pursuant to the *Environmental Protection Act 1994*. The conditions apply unless an amendment is approved pursuant to the *Environmental Protection Act 1994*.
- (2) The environmental authority holder is to give the administering authority a financial assurance in the amount and form and at a time required by the administering authority.
- (3) The environmental authority holder must comply with each of the Standard Environmental Conditions contained in the *Code of Environmental Compliance for Mining Lease Projects* dated January 2001.
- (4) The environmental authority holder must not carry out activities in areas of an endangered regional ecosystem however the holder is authorised to carry out activities within 1 km of the endangered regional ecosystems¹.
- (5) In carrying out activities permitted by Condition 4 the environmental authority holder is not authorised to cause environmental harm in a Category B Environmentally Sensitive Area.

¹ Condition A4 is an additional condition that overrides Standard Environmental Condition 14 to the extent that SEC 14 prohibits the holder of the environmental authority carrying out activities within 1km of a endangered regional ecosystem (Category B) environmentally sensitive area.

EPA maps identify areas of an endangered regional ecosystem along the south-western corner of the lease.
