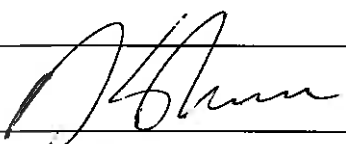
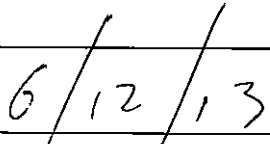

A person carrying out an ERA must also be a registered suitable operator under the *Environmental Protection Act 1994* (EP Act).

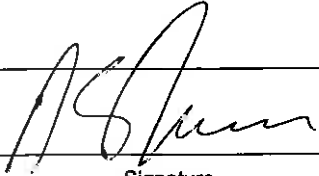

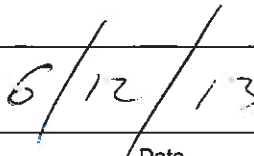

Contaminated land

It is a requirement of the EP Act that if an owner or occupier of land becomes aware a notifiable activity (as defined in Schedule 3 and Schedule 4) is being carried out on the land, or that the land has been, or is being, contaminated by a hazardous contaminant, the owner or occupier must, within 22 business days after becoming so aware, give written notice to the chief executive.

Obligations under the *Environmental Protection Act 1994*

In addition to the requirements found in the conditions of this environmental authority, the holder must also meet their obligations under the EP Act, and the regulations made under the EP Act. For example, the holder must comply with the following provisions of the Act:

- general environmental duty (section 319)
- duty to notify environmental harm (section 320-320G)
- offence of causing serious or material environmental harm (sections 437-439)
- offence of causing environmental nuisance (section 440)
- offence of depositing prescribed water contaminants in waters and related matters (section 440ZG)
- offence to place contaminant where environmental harm or nuisance may be caused (section 443)

Conditions of environmental authority

With the exception of any variations, the conditions of approval for this environmental authority include standard conditions contained within the attached document(s) entitled:

- Code of Environmental Compliance for Mining Lease Projects

Variations to the standard conditions include:

Agency Interest: General

- G1 The conditions of this environmental authority are in force until a surrender of the authority is accepted pursuant to the *Environmental Protection Act 1994*. The conditions apply unless an amendment is approved pursuant to the *Environmental Protection Act 1994*.
- G2 The holder of this environmental authority is to give the administering authority financial assurance in the amount and form and at a time required by the administering authority.
- G3 The holder of this environmental authority must comply with each of the standard environmental conditions contained in the latest version of the *Code of Environmental Compliance for Mining Lease Projects*.

Agency Interest: Land

- L1 Appropriate baseline studies of fauna and flora must be undertaken prior to the commencement of any mining activity in order to identify threatened species, sensitive ecosystems and ecosystem dependent species including (but not limited to) in the National Parks.

No mining activity can occur until the administering authority is satisfied that such baseline studies for the potential impacts of mining have been undertaken, and until the administering authority is also satisfied that appropriate strategies for air, noise, vibration, land waste, surface water and groundwater have been put into place to ensure that all mining activities will not significantly adversely affect any threatened species, sensitive ecosystems and ecosystem dependent species identified by the baseline studies.

Such strategies shall be implemented at all times for the conduct of all mining activities.
