Environmentally relevant activities

It is a requirement of the EP Act that if an owner or occupier of land becomes aware a notifiable activity (as defined in Schedule 3 and Schedule 4) is being carried out on the land, or that the land has been, or is being, contaminated by a hazardous contaminant, the owner or occupier must, within 22 business days after becoming so aware, give written notice to the chief executive.

Obligations under the *Environmental Protection Act 1994*

In addition to the requirements found in the conditions of this environmental authority, the holder must also meet their obligations under the EP Act, and the regulations made under the EP Act. For example, the holder must comply with the following provisions of the Act:

- general environmental duty (section 319)
- duty to notify environmental harm (section 320-320G)
- offence of causing serious or material environmental harm (sections 437-439)
- offence of causing environmental nuisance (section 440)
- offence of depositing prescribed water contaminants in waters and related matters (section 440ZG)
- offence to place contaminant where environmental harm or nuisance may be caused (section 443)

Conditions of environmental authority

With the exception of any variations, the conditions of approval for this environmental authority include standard conditions contained within the attached document(s) entitled:

- Code of environmental compliance for Mining Lease Projects

Variations to the standard conditions include:

Category B Environmentally Sensitive Areas

- G1** Despite condition 14 of the Code of Environmental Compliance for Mining Lease Projects, activities are authorised to occur within 1km of, but not within, the Endangered Remnant Regional Ecosystem (Category B Environmentally Sensitive Area).
- G2** Mining activities are not permitted within **matters of state environmental significance**.

Definitions **Matters of state environmental significance** have the meaning as defined in Schedule 2 of the *Environmental Offsets Regulation 2014*.
