Environmentally relevant activities

The description of any environmentally relevant activity (ERA) for which an environmental authority is issued is a restatement of the ERA as defined by legislation at the time the approval is issued. A person carrying out an ERA must also be a registered suitable operator under the *Environmental Protection Act 1994* (EP Act).

Contaminated land

It is a requirement of the EP Act that if an owner or occupier of land becomes aware a notifiable activity (as defined in Schedule 3 and Schedule 4) is being carried out on the land, or that the land has been, or is being, contaminated by a hazardous contaminant, the owner or occupier must, within 22 business days after becoming so aware, give written notice to the chief executive.

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Obligations under the *Environmental Protection Act 1994*

In addition to the requirements found in the conditions of this environmental authority, the holder must also meet their obligations under the EP Act, and the regulations made under the EP Act. For example, the holder must comply with the following provisions of the Act:

- general environmental duty (section 319)
- duty to notify environmental harm (section 320-320G)
- offence of causing serious or material environmental harm (sections 437-439)
- offence of causing environmental nuisance (section 440)
- offence of depositing prescribed water contaminants in waters and related matters (section 440ZG)
- offence to place contaminant where environmental harm or nuisance may be caused (section 443)

Schedule of conditions

Schedule A – General Conditions

(A1) The Conditions of this environmental authority are in force until a surrender of the authority is accepted pursuant to the Environmental Protection Act 1994. The conditions apply unless an amendment is approved pursuant to the Environmental Protections Act 1994.

(A2) The environmental authority holder is to give the administering authority a financial assurance in the amount and form and at a time required by the administering authority.

(A3) The environmental authority holder must comply with each of the Standard Environmental Conditions contained in the Code of Environmental Compliance for Exploration and Mineral Development Projects dated January 2001.

Schedule B – Additional Conditions

(B1) The environmental authority holder is authorised, subject to conditions B2 to B3, to carry out standard mining activities on the relevant tenement in, or within 500m of, any endangered regional ecosystems.

(B2) Where carrying out activities in endangered regional ecosystems as permitted by B1 the environmental authority holder must do so in accordance with the undertakings in Supporting Information to Application for Standard Environmental Authority – Request to carry out activities in endangered regional ecosystems signed on behalf of the holder 26 November 2001.

(B3) In regard to complying with Standard Environmental; Condition 42, the environmental authority holder must spread seeds or plant species that will promote vegetation of a similar species and density of vocer to that of the pre-disturbed areas, within the areas identified as endangered regional ecosystem.
